Subject: Consider Recommendation on Preferred Draft Corridor and Segment 3 Design

The third community workshop for the Livable Moraga Road was held on September 29, 2014. At that meeting, the consultant team presented an overall corridor concept for Moraga Road, including various intersection and other improvements, as well as a series of design options for corridor Segment 3, which extends from Donald Drive to Corliss Drive.

A joint meeting of the Planning Commission, Design Review Board and Park and Recreation Commission has been scheduled for October 21 to review and consider a recommendation to the Town Council on a preferred concept and options for Moraga Road. Following the October 21 meeting and prior to Town Council consideration of the preferred option for Moraga Road, a second TAC meeting will be scheduled to review the recommendation and make revisions as needed, prior to forwarding it to the Town Council

The Segment 3 options reflect three alternative concepts, involving different configurations of travel lanes, parking, bicycle and pedestrian facilities. All three include both a "short-term" and a "long-term" option, with the short term option reflecting improvements that can be accommodated within the existing paved roadway width.

As presented to the public on September 29, the Segment 3 options each included a similar long-term pavement width of 80 feet. Following the meeting, staff received additional feedback from TAC member Kuckuk, who suggested it would be beneficial to consider an option that would require less expansion of the roadway, respecting the numerous physical and other constraints to roadway widening in this area. In response, the consultant has developed a revised set of options, including one that requires a narrower cross-section.
