Preparing for Wildland Fire Season

March 8 – 7:00 PM

Officials from the Moraga-Orinda Fire District will host a virtual community meeting on Tuesday evening, March 8 at 7:00 pm via Zoom. Residents are invited to hear a presentation that will include a fire season outlook, what residents can do to prepare by clearing combustive vegetation, the annual vegetation abatement deadline, how to report unsafe conditions, and the requirement to remove dead trees. Following the presentation there will be time for questions and answers.

MOFD staff will present an informational public meeting on the proposed Ordinance 22-03, An ordinance of the Moraga-Orinda Fire District of Contra Costa County, California, designating the Local Responsibility Areas (LRA) previously designated as Wildland Urban Interface – Fire Area as (LRA) Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zones. The proposed changes would require all new construction and subdivisions to comply with the California Board of Forestry Fire Safe Regulations found in California Code of Regulations
