TOWN COUNCIL ACTIONS ON MAY 24, 2023

MASTER FEE SCHEDULE ADOPTION

Each Year, Town staff prepares the Master Fee Schedule and the Town Council reviews and approves local user and regulatory fees on an annual basis. Employee hourly rates have been adjusted as well as various fees for General Government, Parks & Recreation, Planning, Public Works, and Development Impact Fee. The Town Council unanimously approved the annual FY 2023-24 Master Fee Schedule on May 25, 2023. The FY 2023-24 Master Fee Schedule will become effective on July 23, 2023.

2022 CALIFORNIA BUILDING STANDARDS CODE

Town Council approved the adoption of the 2022 California Building Standards Code (CBSC) which became effective January 1, 2023. The CBSC represents the new minimum required standards for building construction in California. The CBSC reflects changes in technology, fire safety techniques, and updates in the building industry. Although these codes apply statewide, Health and Safety Code sections authorize a local jurisdiction to modify these codes with more restrictive building standards due to local climatic, geological, topographical, or environmental conditions. LAMORINDA ZERO WASTE CHALLENGE FINAL RECAP

After Week Five, there were 129 Lamorinda residents signed up for the [Zero Waste Challenge](#), with Lafayette having the most points on the City Leaderboard! At the end of the six weeks of the Challenge, there were 131 total residents signed up. *Moraga earned the most points overall* from the start of the Challenge to the end: 99,880 points. Each point means one lb. of CO2 reduced (or one gallon of water saved, depending on the action). Lafayette earned 70,970 total points and Orinda earned 16,090. Overall, all three cities combined earned 186,940 points which means Lamorinda saved that many pounds of CO2! [View the spreadsheet](#) that shows the points earned per week. Over the six weeks, Lafayette grew their points by ~17%, Moraga by ~9%, and Orinda by ~3%. It was great to see so many Lamorinda citizens taking action to lower their carbon footprint! FREE BUSES BETWEEN ORINDA AND ROCKRIDGE BART THIS WEEKEND



This holiday day weekend, May 27 to 29, free buses will replace train service between Rockridge and Orinda stations while BART conducts major trackwork. Riders can expect delays of 30 minutes in the work area. Riders can keep up with service impacts including the latest real-time departure information by downloading the official BART app or by viewing the service advisory. This is the fourth of five nonconsecutive weekends where free buses will replace train service between these two stations. After this weekend, the one remaining “bus bridge weekend” will be June 10 to 11. This important BART modernization work is made possible by Measure RR, which was approved by BART District voters in 2016.
