


# Town of Moraga Evacuation Plan Zones



11/18/2018





## **Zone MOR 01 (Campolindo)**

### **Special Concerns**

Open space to the west of Zone 1 poses a high fire danger during fire season, especially given the limited access to the area. There is a fire gate, kept locked, at the dead-end of Campolindo Drive that leads to an EBMUD fire trail. The trail connects to the Lafayette Reservoir Rim Trail, potentially providing access to Rheem Blvd or the main entrance to the park.

### **Description**

Zone 1 is a residential neighborhood that is located north of Campolindo High School. The neighborhood consists of single family, detached residences and is bordered by open space on the north and west sides.

### **Critical Sites**

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints - 3776 Via Granada.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 1 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Moraga Road via either Campolindo Drive or Via Granada.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 1 residents:

- Campolindo High School
- Rheem Valley Campus of St. Mary's College
- Lafayette Elementary School

### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 1 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Via Granada
- Moraga Road at Campolindo Drive



## **Zone MOR 02 (Campolindo High School)**

### **Special Concerns**

1. The Acalanes High School District corporation yard is located at the south side of the campus. This yard has both regular and diesel fuel tanks located on site, as well as a minor amount of hazardous materials.
2. There is open space southwest of the campus which has been the site of a number of wildland fires.

### **Description**

This zone consists of Campolindo High School, which was built in 1962 and houses approximately 1300 high school students. There is also a corporation yard and swim club that are included in this zone.

### **Critical Sites**

In addition to the high school, the Campolindo Cabana Swim Club is located at the west end of the zone on Campolindo Drive. This facility can be occupied by over 100 people on a weekend day or evening.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 2 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Moraga Road via either Campolindo Drive or Via Granada. Residents should keep Moraga Road clear for emergency vehicles.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as evacuation collection sites for Zone 2 residents:

- Rheem Valley Campus of St. Mary's College
- LDS Church located at 3776 Via Granada


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 2 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Campolindo Drive
- Moraga Road at Via Granada

## **Zone MOR 03 (Natalie)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space to the north, south and east of Zone 3, which could be a potential hazard from wildland fires. There was a fire in this area in 2015, which burned grass and brush, but was kept out of the neighborhood. A fire in 2018 burned the grass and brush on the south side of the neighborhood, requiring the evacuation of homes on Buckingham Drive.

### **Description**

The zone is a residential neighborhood located on the opposite side of Moraga Road from Campolindo High School. The neighborhood has mature trees and other vegetation that is maintained by homeowners.

### **Critical Sites**

None

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 3 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Moraga Road via Campolindo, Woodford or Buckingham Drives. Residents will be directed either north or south on Moraga Road, depending upon the location of the incident.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following area should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone residents:

- Rheem Shopping Center – parking lot near Starbucks
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive parking lot
- Lafayette Elementary School on Moraga Road


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 3 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Campolindo Drive
- Moraga Road at Buckingham Drive
- Moraga Road at Rheem Blvd.

## **Zone MOR 04 (Francisca)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space west of the zone which has been the location of grass fires in 2016-2018.

### **Description**

Zone 4 is a residential area, consisting of townhouses, condominiums or single-family homes built in the mid 1980's. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone that is maintained by a professional landscaping company.

### **Critical Sites**

The Acalanes Union High School District corporation yard is located on the north side of the zone. There are gas and diesel pumps as well as construction and cleaning supplies located in the yard.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 4 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Moraga Road via either Hansen Court or Delores Court.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following area should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 4 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Rheem Valley Shopping Center – near Starbucks
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive parking lot
- Lafayette Elementary School


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 4 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Hansen Court
- Moraga Road at Rheem Blvd.
- Moraga Road at Campolindo DriveZone

## **Zone MOR 05 (Rheem West)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space north of the zone which has been the location of grass fires in 2016-2018.

### **Description**

Zone 5 is a primarily residential area, consisting of single-family homes, apartment buildings (300 block of Rheem), Town offices and an office building. Most properties are landscaped and feature mature plants and trees. Rheem Blvd. is a major connector street that runs between Moraga and Orinda.

### **Critical Sites**

The following critical sites are located in Zone 5:

- Town of Moraga offices are located at 329 Rheem Blvd.
- Town of Moraga Council Chambers and corporation yard is located at 335 Rheem Blvd. Small amounts of fuel, solvents and maintenance materials are stored in this location.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 5 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Rheem Blvd., then either east to Moraga Road or west to Glorietta, depending upon the location of the incident.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following area should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 5 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Rheem Valley Shopping Center – near Starbucks
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive parking lot
- Lafayette Elementary School


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 5 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Rheem Blvd. at Glorietta Blvd. (Orinda)
- Rheem Blvd. at Moraga Road.

## **Zone MOR 06 (Rheem)**

### **Special Concerns**

There are a number of commercial businesses in this area that may be highly populated at certain times of the day or night. Contact should be made with business owners and managers to ensure they are empty and secured when the area is evacuated.

### **Description**

Zone 6 is a primarily commercial area, with some multi-unit apartment buildings in the 300 block of Rheem Blvd. The zone consists of the Rheem Valley Shopping Center, commercial areas on the east side of Moraga Road in the 500 block and businesses and multi-family residential on Rheem Blvd. Both Moraga Road and Rheem Blvd. are major connector streets that would be used for evacuation and access for emergency vehicles.

### **Critical Sites**

The following critical sites are located in Zone 6:

- Gas stations located at the intersection of Moraga Road and Rheem Blvd.
- Orion Academy School located at 350 Rheem Blvd.
- Moraga Post-Acute Rehabilitation Center located at 348 Rheem Blvd.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 6 is necessary, residents should evacuate and use either Moraga Road or Rheem Blvd. to leave the area, depending upon the location of the incident and direction from emergency responders.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 6 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive parking lot
- Moraga Center parking lot near Safeway or former OSH building


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 6 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Rheem Blvd. at Glorietta Blvd. (Orinda)
- Rheem Blvd. at Moraga Road.

## **Zone MOR 08 (Lucas)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space north of the zone (across Rheem Blvd.) that consists of grasses and brush. There is also similar open space within the zone.

### **Description**

Zone 8 is a residential area, consisting of single-family homes. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone. Most yards are maintained, but some homes do not have defensible space.

### **Critical Sites**

None.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 8 is necessary, residents should evacuate to either Rheem Blvd. or Moraga Road.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 8 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive parking lot
- Lafayette Elementary School
- Moraga Center parking lot near OSH


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 8 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Lucas Drive
- Moraga Road at Rheem Blvd.
- Rheem Blvd. at Chalda Way

## **Zone MOR 09 (Ascot)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space west and north of the zone which contains grasses, brush and trees. Both major access streets are dead-end streets.

### **Description**

Zone 9 is a residential area, consisting of multi-family dwellings, including apartments, townhouses, condominiums and attached single family homes. Ascot Drive has a steep grade and is narrow in some places, restricting access. Donald Drive is narrow and often has cars parked on either side, potentially slowing access for emergency vehicles. Both Ascot and Donald dead end at the west end of the streets.

### **Critical Sites**

- Hacienda de las Flores (2100 Donald Drive) – is a reservable facility that can have up to 700 people attending an outside event.
- Rheem Elementary School – is located at the end of Laird Drive
- This zone is critical due to the high density of the population, narrow and steep access road and that there is only one point of ingress and egress. Be aware of traffic conflicts between vehicles attempting to leave the area and emergency vehicles responding to an incident.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 9 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Moraga Road via either Donald Drive or Ascot Drive.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following area should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 9 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive parking lot
- Lafayette Elementary School
- Moraga Center parking lot near Safeway


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 9 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Ascot Drive
- Moraga Road at Donald Drive

## **Zone MOR 10 (Devin)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space south and west of the zone which contains grasses, brush and trees. The Hacienda de las Flores is on the north side of the zone and features heavy vegetation along Laguna Creek and above the buildings.

### **Description**

Zone 10 is a residential area, consisting of single-family homes. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone. Homes in the zone are located along Moraga Road or are accessed by Devin Drive on the west side of Moraga Road.

### **Critical Sites**

None

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 10 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Moraga Road via Devin Drive.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following area should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 10 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Moraga Center Shopping Center – near Safeway or OSH
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive parking lot
- Lafayette Elementary School


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 10 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Devin Drive

## **Zone MOR 11 (Fernwood)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space northeast of the zone which has been the location of grass fires in 2016-2018.

### **Description**

Zone 11 is a residential area, consisting of single-family homes. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone. Most streets connect with Fernwood Drive that runs in a circle around the zone. Many of these streets are dead-end streets, resulting in most or all traffic being routed on to Fernwood.

### **Critical Sites**

None, although both the Moraga Commons Park and St. Mary's College are adjacent to the zone.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 11 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Moraga Road via Devin Drive, Rheem Blvd via Fernwood Drive or St. Mary's Road via Stafford Drive.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 11 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Lafayette Community Center parking lot on St. Mary's Road
- Moraga Center Parking Lot – near Safeway or OSH
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot

### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**


When an evacuation of Zone 11 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Devin Drive
- Rheem Blvd. at Fernwood Drive
- Rheem Blvd. at St. Mary's Road
- St. Mary's Road and Stafford Drive

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## **Zone MOR 12 (The Bluffs)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space north and east of the zone which pose a potential fire hazard due to the amount of vegetation. Additionally, there is limited access to the neighborhood via Joseph Drive and Bollinger Canyon Road, resulting in potential conflicts between residents who are evacuating and responding emergency vehicles.

### **Description**

Zone 12 is a residential area, consisting of single-family homes. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone. Access to the neighborhood is via a single street, Joseph Drive.

### **Critical Sites**

- There is a small winery located at the top of Joseph Drive that hosts visitors and small events, increasing the number of people in the neighborhood.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 12 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to St. Mary's Road via Joseph Drive and Bollinger Canyon Road. There is a secondary fire trail that can be used for pedestrian evacuation.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 12 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Lafayette Community Center parking lot on St. Mary's Road
- Moraga Center Parking Lot – near Safeway or OSH
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot

### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 12 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- St. Mary's Road at Bollinger Canyon Road
- Joseph Drive at Bollinger Canyon Road





## **Zone MOR 13 (Camino Ricardo/Corliss)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space north of the zone with fuels consisting of grasses, brush and trees.

### **Description**

Zone 13 is a residential area, consisting of single-family homes. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone. All of the residential streets lead to the connector streets (Corliss Drive, Camino Ricardo, Hardie Drive), which lead out of the zone to Moraga Way and Moraga Road.

### **Critical Sites**

- Los Perales School (22 Wakefield Drive). The school is located at the end of a short cul-de-sac with limited parking and staging for emergency vehicles.
- Gas station located at Moraga Way and Camino Ricardo.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 13 is necessary, residents should evacuate via the following routes:

- Camino Ricardo to Moraga Way
- Corliss Drive to Moraga Road
- Hardie Drive to Moraga Way

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 13 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Moraga Center Parking Lot – near Safeway or OSH
- Rheem Center Parking Lot – near HomeGoods


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 13 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Corliss Drive
- Camino Ricardo at Corliss Drive
- Camino Ricardo at Moraga Way

## **Zone MOR 14 (Miramonte Gardens)**

### **Special Concerns**

Miramonte Gardens is a townhouse development with a single major access point. An additional access point to Ivy Drive is chained off and will need to be opened by responding emergency personnel.

### **Description**

Zone 14 is a residential area, consisting of a townhouse development with approximately 200 residences. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone that is maintained by a landscape company. The zone is accessed via Moraga Way on Miramonte Drive.

### **Critical Sites**

Zone 14 is adjacent to both Miramonte High School and the Moraga Country Club (MCC) golf course.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 14 is necessary, residents should evacuate via the north end of Miramonte Drive to Moraga Way and, when opened, the south end of Miramonte Drive to Ivy Drive. If Moraga Way is blocked, residents can evacuate on foot to the MCC golf course.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 14 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Moraga Center Parking Lot – near Safeway or OSH
- Del Rey School parking lot – 25 El Camino Moraga, Orinda


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 14 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Way at Miramonte Drive
- Moraga Way at Ivy Drive

## **Zone MOR 15 (Moraga Center)**

### **Special Concerns**

- There are a number of commercial businesses in this area that may be highly populated at certain times of the day or night. Contact should be made with business owners and managers to ensure they are empty and secured.
- There is an RV storage area at the north end of the Moraga Ranch that contains a number of RVs with fuel and propane tanks.

### **Description**

Zone 15 is a primarily commercial area, but also includes the Commons Park and some limited residential at the end of Moraga Way and on School Street. It also includes the Moraga Ranch property, which includes an RV storage area and older buildings used for storage.

### **Critical Sites**

- Moraga Commons Park is located at the corner of St. Mary's Road and Moraga Road. The park features special events with large numbers of people. There is also an all-access playground which is used by Access and Functional Needs individuals, who need evacuation assistance.
- Gas stations at the intersection of Moraga Way and Canyon Road

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 15 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Moraga Road or Moraga Way.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 15 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Rheem Center parking lot near HomeGoods
- Miramonte High School – main parking lot


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 15 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Moraga Way
- Moraga Way at School Street
- Moraga Road at St. Mary's Road

## **Zone MOR 16 (Alta Mesa)**

### **Special Concerns**

- There is open space east of the zone.
- Alta Mesa is a dead-end street with an extremely steep grade.

### **Description**

Zone 16 is a residential area, consisting of townhouse and condominium buildings. There is only one way out of the zone; via Alta Mesa to Moraga Road. There is mature landscaping around most of the buildings that is professionally maintained. The zone is bordered by open space on the East side and at the southwest corner.

### **Critical Sites**

- There is a communications tower with radio and cellular telephone antennas at the top of Alta Mesa.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 16 is necessary, residents should evacuate to Moraga Road via Alta Mesa.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 16 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Miramonte High School - main parking lot
- Rheem Center – parking lot near HomeGoods
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 16 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Moraga Road at Alta Mesa

## **Zone MOR 17 (St. Mary's Gardens)**

### **Special Concerns**

There is open space south and east of the zone with fuels consisting of grasses, brush and trees.

### **Description**

Zone 17 is primarily a residential area, consisting of single-family homes, and includes the Moraga Library. The residential neighborhood streets are all accessed by Carter Drive from St. Mary's Road. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone.

### **Critical Sites**

- Moraga Library is located at 1504 St. Mary's Road. There may be unaccompanied children at the site. Additionally, the Moraga Historical Society is located in the library building and stores items of historical significance.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 17 is necessary, residents should evacuate to St. Mary's Road via Carter Drive.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 17 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Lafayette Community Center parking lot on St. Mary's Road
- Moraga Center Parking Lot – near Safeway or OSH
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 17 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- St. Mary's Road and Carter Drive
- St. Mary's Road and Moraga Road
- St. Mary's Road and Rheem Blvd.

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## **Zone MOR 18 (St. Mary's College)**

### **Special Concerns**

This zone consists of the college, which is heavily populated with students and staff; more so when school is in session. Responding units should contact campus public safety staff and coordinate efforts.

### **Description**

Zone 18 is St. Mary's College, which is the only residential university in Contra Costa County. Student and staff campus residences are contained in multi-story buildings, located primarily on the south and west side of the campus. The college is staffed with a Public Safety Department and routinely conducts training and drills about how to respond to an emergency or a disaster. The college has an active emergency plan and staff to fulfill the plan.

### **Critical Sites**

- On-site student and staff housing.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 18 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to St. Mary's Road via St. Mary's Parkway. There is an emergency fire trail located near McKeown Pavilion that leads to Bollinger Canyon Road.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

Although campus officials may designate a different location, the following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 18 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Lafayette Community Center parking lot on St. Mary's Road
- Moraga Center Parking Lot – near Safeway or OSH
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot

### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 18 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- St. Mary's Road and St. Mary's Parkway
- Rheem Blvd. at St. Mary's Road
- Moraga Road at St. Mary's Road





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## **Zone MOR 19 (Moraga Country Club)**

### **Special Concerns**

- There is open space south of the zone with fuels consisting of grass, heavy brush and trees.
- Access to the zone is limited as all streets lead to St. Andrews Drive, which is a two lane street that connects the zone to Moraga Way.

### **Description**

Zone 19 consists of the Moraga Country Club (MCC), including the clubhouse and related facilities, golf course and single-family residential areas. MCC has a security patrol which can assist with traffic direction. Additionally, MCC has established a block captain system to coordinate notifications and expedite evacuations.

### **Critical Sites**

- The MCC clubhouse hosts events with over 300 people. Additionally, there is a large pool with related chemicals located on the west side of the clubhouse.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 19 is necessary, residents should evacuate to Moraga Way via St. Andrews Drive. There is an EVA located at the east end of Augusta Drive, but it is closed due to a landslide.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 19 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot


### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

## **Zone MOR 20 (School - South)**

### **Special Concerns**

- Saklan School is on School Street with approximately 150 students and staff.
- There are two churches on School Street which, in addition to regular services, host special events with up to 300 people.
- There are two adult care facilities near the intersection of Country Club Drive and Canyon Road which will need assistance to evacuate their residents.

### **Description**

Zone 20 consists of a mix of uses, including single-family residential, office buildings, a private school, churches and adult care facilities. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone.

### **Critical Sites**

- Saklan School – 1678 School Street. – has a K-8 student body.
- Holy Trinity Serbian Church – 1700 School Street.
- Willow Spring Community Church – 1689 School Street.
- Moraga Royale – 1600 Canyon Road.
- Aegis Living – 950 Country Club Drive.

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 20 is necessary, residents should evacuate to Moraga Way via School Street or to Canyon Road via Country Club Drive or De La Cruz Way.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 17 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Lafayette Community Center parking lot on St. Mary's Road
- Moraga Center Parking Lot – near Safeway or OSH
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot



## **Zone MOR 21 (Sanders)**

### **Special Concerns**

- There is open space East of the zone with a fuel load consisting of grasses, brush and trees.
- Both Country Club Drive and Sanders Drive are dead-end streets, providing single points of access to both neighborhoods in the zone.

### **Description**

Zone 21 is a residential area, consisting of single-family homes, with a small number of office buildings. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone. The neighborhood streets connect with either Country Club Drive or Sanders Drive. The office buildings are on Country Club near Canyon Road.

### **Critical Sites**

None

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 21 is necessary, residents should evacuate and make their way to Canyon Road via Country Club Drive or Sanders Drive. Barring unforeseen circumstances, residents should evacuate north, towards Moraga Way.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 21 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Rheem Center parking lot near HomeGoods
- Miramonte High School parking lot
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot



## **Zone MOR 22 (Camino Pablo)**

### **Special Concerns**

- There is open space on the East, South and a portion of the west sides of the zone with fuels consisting of grasses, brush and trees.
- Both Larch Avenue and Camino Pablo provide the only access into the neighborhood in the zone.

### **Description**

Zone 22 is a residential area, consisting of single-family homes. There is a large church, Rancho Laguna Park and two public schools in the zone. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone.

### **Critical Sites**

- Rancho Laguna Park is located at the east end of Camino Pablo.
- Camino Pablo School – 1111 Camino Pablo
- Joaquin Moraga School – 1010 Camino Pablo
- St. Monica's Church – 1001 Camino Pablo

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 22 is necessary, residents should evacuate to Canyon Road via Camino Pablo and Larch Avenue. Barring unforeseen circumstances, residents should evacuate on Canyon Road towards Moraga Way.

### **Evacuation Collection Area**

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 22 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Moraga Center parking lot near OSH
- Miramonte High School parking lot
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot

### **Critical Traffic Control Posts**

When an evacuation of Zone 22 is ordered, traffic management at the following locations is critical for access of emergency vehicles and an orderly evacuation of the area:

- Canyon Road at Camino Pablo and Larch Avenue
- Camino Pablo at Larch Avenue

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## **Zone MOR 23 (Sanders Ranch)**

### **Special Concerns**

- The zone is surrounded by open space with fuels consisting of grasses, brush and trees.
- Sanders Ranch Road provides the only access into the zone. There is an EVA that can be used to evacuate to the end of Sanders Drive.

### **Description**

Zone 23 is a gated residential area, consisting of single-family homes. The front gate of the neighborhood is manned 24/7 by a security guard, who can provide access information and assistance. There is mature vegetation growing throughout the zone.

### **Critical Sites**

None

### **Evacuation Routes**

If an evacuation of Zone 23 is necessary, residents should evacuate to Canyon Road via Camino Pablo and Sanders Ranch Road. Barring unforeseen circumstances, residents should evacuate on Canyon Road towards Moraga Way.

The following areas should be considered as local evacuation collection sites for Zone 23 residents, depending upon the location of the incident:

- Joaquin Moraga School – 1010 Camino Pablo
- Miramonte High School parking lot
- Campolindo High School – Campolindo Drive lot
